We also spend more time with one teacher (17 hours in Year 7), which means they get to know us really well and help us settle into secondary school.

What's also good is that we have an extracurricular programme and special focus days. These make learning even more exciting because we get to apply what we've learned in different contexts, in and out of the classroom.
